

How much will it cost?

The cost for RBS 2010 is **RM1100 per person for applicants from IBA-affiliated churches** (you will be required to pay RM600. The balance of RM500 will be paid by your church) and **RM1400 per person for applicants from non IBA-affiliated churches**.

This fee covers all materials, accommodation and food during the length of RBS 2010, personal accident insurance and transport to and from your mission trip destinations. You will have to pay for and arrange your own transportation to Cameron Highlands at the start of RBS and your transportation home after RBS. You will also need to bring some spending money for other expenses you may incur during RBS (e.g. laundry, own food, book purchases etc). Please take note that all students are required to purchase one book for a book report during RBS. You may allocate about RM40 for this.

The difference in the fees above reflects the subsidy given by IBA to students from affiliated churches, as IBA is primarily funded by contributions from those churches. Applicants from non-affiliated churches pay a fee that is closer (but still lower) than the actual cost incurred by that student for the duration of the school.

Cost or other factors should not stand in the way of those who truly desire to attend RBS. Contact your church leaders or the RBS Committee if you encounter any hindrances or restrictions, financial or otherwise, that prevent you from coming to RBS.

How do I register?

To register for RBS 2010, simply obtain an application form from your church elder or youth worker (or download your form from www.rbs.org.my), fill it out, and mail it together with a **non-refundable RM100 deposit** (payable by cheque only and in favour of 'Residential Bible School') to:

Remember the closing date for RBS 2010 is **4 October 2009**. Applications received after this date will either be rejected or subjected to a late registration penalty of RM50. Applications received without the RM100 deposit will also be rejected. There is a maximum enrolment of **48 students**, and places at RBS fill up very quickly, so don't delay! All applications will be treated on a first-come first-served basis.

What is RBS all about?

RBS is an annual short-term school run by the Brethren Assemblies of Malaysia, as a ministry of Inter Brethren Assemblies (IBA) Youth Development. It is designed for Christian young people interested in growing in their relationship with God, equipping themselves with a better knowledge of God's Word, and learning skills to serve God more effectively. The focus is on **discipleship** based on the **Word of God** as the foundation for all aspects of our life.

The RBS curriculum is designed to:

- **INSPIRE** you to a heartfelt and committed devotion to God;
- **INSTRUCT** you in his Word in the fundamentals of your faith, so that you might grow to become a mature, thinking Christian rather than a spoon-fed one;
- **INVOLVE** you in practical service for God through the missions trips.

The RBS 2010 programme includes:

- Lectures and workshops
- Assignments and journaling
- Communal worship, prayer and daily devotions
- Weekend mission trip to the Orang Asli villages
- Mission trip to small churches throughout Malaysia
- Games and outdoor activities
- Personal counselling (voluntary)
- Graduation Night

Who can attend RBS?

RBS is targeted at students in their late teens, specifically those who have just completed Form 5 and 6 and are waiting for their exam results. Others may apply and will be considered on an individual basis. Preference is given to youth from Brethren assemblies throughout Malaysia. Applicants from non-Brethren churches will be considered on a standby basis. You must be a born-again Christian and the leaders of your church must approve your application to attend RBS.

Please note that if you are accepted, you must attend the entire duration of the school (exceptions will only be provided for family emergencies).
